MT HB2 Position: Bill Summary:	General Appropriations Act Monitor An act appropriating money to various state agencies for the biennium ending June 30, 2023 and providing an immediate effective date. After an amendment was made and accepted to move regions/CVBs from statutory appropriations to be part of the Montana Department of Commerce general fund budget, we were able to reverse that on March 31, 2021. We thank Senator Bartel for hearing the industry's concerns and moving to keep regions/CVBs as they are currently in the lodging facility use tax statute. In the last week of the session, the original \$400,000 that Virginia Nevada City receives was struck and replaced with 2.7% or \$1,000,000 (whichever is less) from Department of Commerce's 63%. \$600,000 of that amount per year is only for six years to allow for deferred maintenance and backlogs to be completed. After that, Virginia Nevada City funding will be 2.7% or \$400,000 (whichever is less). The Montana Heritage Preservation and Development Commission shall report on the use of funds received to the legislative finance committee on a semiannual basis.

Under this act, Montana would stay in mountain daylight savings time (currently the time we have during the summer hours). Montana would not fall back in the autumn to mountain standard time. Permanent daylight-saving time refers to the year-round observation of daylight-saving time (DST). Permanent DST eliminates the practice of biannual clock changes. A change in federal law would be necessary to allow states to observe DST permanently all year. A number of states have pursued state bills, resolutions, and referendums to indicate intention to observe permanent DST if federal law would permit it.
